9 Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; ¹⁰ love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. ¹¹ Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. ^[a] ¹² Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. ¹³ Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.

¹⁴ Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. ¹⁵ Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ¹⁶ Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; ^[b] do not claim to be wiser than you are. ¹⁷ Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. ¹⁸ If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. ¹⁹ Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; ^[c] for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." ²⁰ No, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." ²¹ Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

What is God Saying?

One of the real privileges of Ministry is to have the chance to stand at the front of the chapel, crematorium or graveside, and pay tribute to the person for whom we have come to give thanks.

A tribute, or eulogy, will include not just facts about her/his life (where they were born, schooled or employed), but how they are remembered – what kind of person they were – what we can learn from them.

Preaching from this passage from the pulpit would allow me to be able to unpack this passage, and to focus on the specific instructions Paul gives us — along with examples of what his teaching might mean for us in our own context. However, to do so here would mean producing many more pages than you have become used to!

I think also, there are some passages which just seem to say it as it is, and that don't always need spelling out, interpreting, explaining or unpacking as much as others. They make sense, and sometimes there's nothing I or anyone else can add to make it any clearer.

So I'm not going to.....except to ask a question:

Could this teaching of Paul be re-worded and used as a tribute / eulogy to me or you?

In other words, could it be said of me or you:

Her/his love was genuine; he hated what is evil, and held fast to what is good. She loved others with affection; He outdid others in showing honour. She never lagged in zeal, was ardent in spirit, and served the Lord. He rejoiced in hope, was patient in suffering, persevered in prayer. She contributed to the needs of the saints and extended hospitality to strangers.

S/he will be remembered as someone who blessed those who persecuted her/him. She blessed and did not curse them. He rejoiced with those who rejoice, and wept with those who weep.

We thank God for the way he lived in harmony with others, was never haughty, but associated with those who were lowly. She never claimed to be wiser than she was. He never re-payed anyone evil for evil, but took thought for what is noble in the sight of all. She sought to live peaceably with all. He didn't look to avenge himself, but entrusted those who offended him to God. She fed her enemies who were hungry and gave drink to those who were thirsty. He will be remembered as someone who was not overcome by evil, but sought to overcome evil with good.

So....would that be a fitting tribute to your life or mine? If not, what needs to change?
